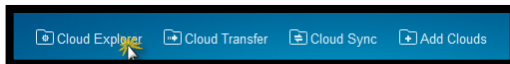


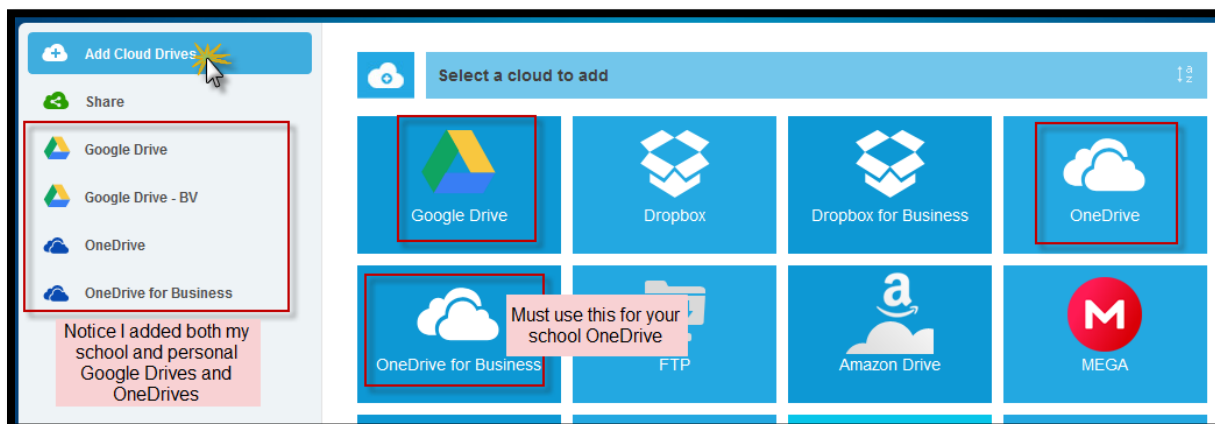
MultCloud – free cloud transfer WEB2oOL

Note that simply sharing your Google and OneDrive folder to a personal cloud drive will not be a permanent solution. After the deactivation date last year, we noted that it took another 6 months for the Google account to officially expire. So it looked like it was working, but students reported that they lost their BV Google Drive files (non-recoverable). I imagine that this also might be the case with OneDrive. So it is strongly suggested that you either download the files, or use a cloud transfer tool to ensure that they are permanently yours. I tested the cloud transfer tool MultCloud, and it worked nicely.

1. Sign up @ <https://www.multcloud.com/> - I would suggest that you register with your personal email.
2. Make sure you have a cloud to move your files to. You can move both Google and OneDrive to the same cloud. Notice below that you have a variety of clouds to move them to. You can sign up for a free personal OneDrive as well.
3. Click Cloud Explorer / Add Cloud Drives.
4. Select OneDrive for Business for your school OneDrive.



Set up all that you need (notice I set up 4 below). Caveat: You may have to sign out of accounts to add others. For example, I was signed into my personal Google account and when I tried to add my school Google account it took me to my personal one. The solution was to sign out of my personal Google account first, then retry.



5. Then select Cloud Transfer, and select the cloud that you want to transfer from and the one you want to transfer to. Below shows what to select when transferring your OneDrive files. You can transfer them to any other cloud!
